

The Day of Hope: Zephaniah 3:9 – 3:20

- 1. To get in to the passage, go through 3:9-20 and list out the amazing things God promises for his people on the Day of Hope.
 - What are some contrasts with the preceding chapters?
- 2. Zephaniah 3:14-17 describe the intimate relationship God will have with his people in the new covenant. And yet in 1:4-6, God describes his judgement on his people who are worshipping the LORD but also idols.
 - Pick out some of the marks of the relationship God describes in 3:14-17.
 - Discuss what idols we have today. These can often be revealed by looking at what we fear, or what we daydream about. What stops us running to God

- 3. Read Ezekiel 11:17-20 and Jeremiah 32:37-41
 - Pick out some of the marks of the new covenant that resonate with Zephaniah 3:9-20.
 - Which of the promises about the Day of Hope that is described in 3:9-20 are for God's people now (in light of what Jesus has done for us) and which are still to come? You could look at these three sections:
 - 3:9-13 God will change his people because they can't change themselves
 - 3:14-17 God will have an intimate relationship with his people
 - o 3:18-20 God will restore their fortunes
