

#4 don't go back

This week at Magdalen Road Church in chapter 3:1-14, we considered something of why the Galatians might be tempted to go back, but also how Paul sought to persuade them not to.

Before we got into the text though, we noted that the majority of believers Galatia would be gentle background believers who would have grown up with the idea that they could keep their pagan deity on side by the things that they do. Paul is concerned that these Christians will slide back into a works mentality as people are seeking to persuade them to adopt Jewish practices. It's a different 'vending machine', but it still a 'vending machine' model.
