
This is an excellent starting point for those who want to be better informed.




SAGE

New Issues Facing Christians Today **John Stott (IVP)**



Beyond this the Christian books on the environment are legion. Two particularly useful ones are mentioned below.


Creation in Crisis: Christian Perspectives on Sustainability **Robert White, Ed. (SPCK, 2009)**
